

OUR MUSEUM HISTORY COLLECTION

The Village Museum has a library dedicated to the history of the area and the history of New Mexico to aid in research.

The Museum carries a wide variety of transcribed church records from local parishes to aid in the search for information.

Museum staff have created an extensive genealogy database linking historic residents and have recorded a variety of oral histories that can be drawn upon to fulfill your genealogy research needs.

The Museum has a computer lab to access genealogy resources. There is a comprehensive online source of information for conducting genealogical and local history research, providing access to over 10 billion historical records.

Ancestry Library Edition provides access to billions of historical documents, millions of historical photos, plus local narratives, oral histories, indexes and other resources in over 30,000 databases that span from the 1500s to the 2000s. Available on the Museum and Library public access computers.

QUALITY OF LIFE IN LOS LUNAS

The Village of Los Lunas makes quality of life amenities a priority.

The Parks and Recreation Department maintains 17 parks and two open space preserves, runs youth and adult sports leagues throughout the year, and organizes special events like the Fourth of July Celebration and the Christmas Light Parade.

The Los Lunas Public Library offers a wealth of in-person and digital resources and acts as a hub for STEAM events and educational programming.

The Museum of Heritage & Arts, a branch of the Public Library, showcases the arts, culture and history of Valencia County.

CELEBRATE 100 YEARS OF ROUTE 66

U.S. Route 66 was established in 1926, connecting Chicago, Illinois to Santa Monica, California. 2026 will mark the 100th Anniversary of Route 66.

The Village of Los Lunas was located on the original alignment of Route 66 from 1926 to 1937 before it was rerouted through Albuquerque.

Los Lunas is excited to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of Route 66 and will be hosting events throughout 2026 in honor of the part played in the early years of the Route.

Village officials would like to have a special commemorative logo made to align all of our events.

A graphic artist will create a logo that embodies our history on Route 66. This logo will be used on promotional materials, websites, advertisements, event postings, etc.

Submissions must be made through EntryThingy.com. The title of the call is Route 66 Centennial Logo - Los Lunas, New Mexico.

Each artist may submit up to three unique designs or variation. For the purposes of the initial application, an image of your logo design is sufficient.

If selected, a vector file that can be expanded without losing quality is expected. The logo should be circular. Logo should be in color, but if selected, a black and white version will also be requested.

If you would like to submit the corresponding B&W version with your application, please feel free to do so.

This call is open to all artists living in the United States. There is no cost for entry for artists. Top three artists selected will have their designs, names, handles, etc. displayed on posters at the Los Lunas Administrative Building and on the Village website at www.loslunasnm.gov. Letters conveying that the artist was on the short list of winners will be mailed to those artists.

The winning artist will have their logo featured prominently on marketing collateral and events pertaining to Route 66 activities. They will also receive a one-time cash prize of \$250.

GROSS RECEIPTS TAX

We all spend more at certain times of the year. The holiday season is usually a time for more spending.

Gross Receipts Tax (GRT) is imposed on goods and services throughout New Mexico, including the Village of Los Lunas. Revenue collected from GRT benefits our local communities.

The minimum combined 2026 sales tax rate for Los Lunas is 8.425%, which is the total of state, county and municipal tax rates.

The State of New Mexico’s portion is 4.875%, Valencia County’s portion is 1.375%, and the Village of Los Lunas’s portion is 2.175%.
