## VILLAGE COUNCIL ELECTION NOV. 2, 2021

Registered voters in three Village Council districts may vote in the November 2, 2021, election. Any voter who is not registered by October 5 may register and vote the same day at any early voting site.

Up for election are Council Seats in Village Council Districts One, Three, and Four.

Candidates are Christopher S. Ortiz, District One; Cruz Muñoz, District Three; and Phillip Jaramillo, Helen A. Jaramillo, and James T. Runyun, District Four.

In addition to other Voting Convenience Centers (VCC) located throughout Valencia County, two polling sites will be open in Los Lunas from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, November 2, 2021:

- Village of Los Lunas Village Hall, 660 Main St. NW, Los Lunas
- Los Lunas Schools Administration, 119 Luna St. SE, Los Lunas

The Valencia County Bureau of Elections office will be handling the Village election.

There is no council election in Village Council District Two, or for Mayor, or Municipal Judge, which will take place in November 2023.

## VILLAGE PROJECTS INCLUDE ADDITIONAL I-25 OFF RAMP

More than 60 projects are being worked on in the Village of Los Lunas. Some projects might be considered minor like sidewalk repair. Other projects could be called major such as the rebuilding of road intersections.

Projects are not always visible to the public like improving computer technology or the wastewater treatment plant.

Other projects are not the responsibility of the Village, such as the Courthouse Road and NM Hwy 314 realignment project (state), or miscellaneous fiber optic line installation projects (private companies).

Funding for the projects comes from a variety of sources including loans, the Village budget, grants, and state funds.

Several current projects were featured in the August 2021 Village Newsletter.

Here are five more:

- Edeal Road and Main Street / NM Hwy 6 Intersection Improvements -- construct a new signalized traffic intersection with turn lanes and concrete medians.
- Main Street / NM Hwy 6 Landscaping Improvements from Canal Boulevard to Los Cerritos Road -- landscaping improvements on Main Street between Canal Boulevard and Los Cerritos Road in front of the New Mexico State Campus to include sidewalk replacement, irrigation, trees, plants, rock, and park benches.
- NM Hwy 6 Trail / Sun Ranch Village Road to Jubilee Los Lunas -- design and construct a multi-use trail along NM Hwy 6 between Sun Ranch Village Road and Jubilee Boulevard, including signage, striping, drainage, landscaping, and lighting.
- Water Tank 3 Site Improvements ("Tiger Tank") -- drill new water well; water tank rehab, and build new arsenic treatment facilities.
- Interstate 25 Off-Ramp Second Lane -- construct a second right-turn lane southbound onto NM Hwy 6 from Interstate 25, including roadway signal improvements on Desert Willow. This improvement will support upcoming economic development west of I-25 and meet New Mexico Department of Transportation State Access Manual (SAM) requirements.

## FIRE PREVENTION WEEK YEAR-ROUND

Fire Prevention Week is October 3-9, 2021, but fire prevention should be year-round.

Village Fire Chief John Gabaldon points out that everyone should learn the sounds of fire safety. If there is a beep or chirp coming out of your smoke or carbon monoxide alarm you should know what it means.

Knowing the difference between a beep and a chirp can save you, your home, and your family! Make sure everyone in the home understands the sounds of the smoke and carbon monoxide alarm and knows how to respond.

Learn the sounds of your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms by checking the user guide or research the brand and model online.

Make sure your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms meet the needs of everyone in your home, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.

Some tips: install a bedside alert device that responds to the sound of the smoke and carbon monoxide alarms. Use of a low frequency alarm can also wake a sleeping person with mild to severe hearing loss.

Sleep with your mobility device, glasses, and phone, close to your bed.

Keep pathways like hallways lit with nightlights free from clutter to make sure everyone can get out safely.

Remember that if you hear a chirp make a change! A chirping alarm needs attention. Replace the batteries or the entire unit if it's over 10 years old. If you don't remember how old the unit is then replace it.

## VILLAGE ICIP PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

The Los Lunas Village Council has approved the Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan (ICIP) for Fiscal Years 2023 through 2027.

The top five ICIP projects are:

- I-25 Interchange and Bridge Construction in the category of Transportation - Highways/Roads/Bridges, has a total project cost of \$125 million with \$93.1 million funded to date.
- Central Rail Park Utility Extensions – Other Category-Utilities (publicly owned), \$6.4 million total project cost, \$4.1 million funded to date.
- Carson Park Phase 2 Infrastructure Improvements – Water - Storm/Surface Water Control \$7.5 million total project cost, \$2.0 million funded to date.
- Valencia Regional Emergency Communications Center (VRECC) Radio Upgrades – Equipment - Public Safety Equipment; \$3,230,560 total project cost, \$0 funded to date.
- Castillo Street (Road Improvements) – Transportation - Highways/Roads/Bridges, \$1,255,000 total project cost, \$0 funded to date.

At National Night Out, Lieutenant Frank Lucero presented PNM with an appreciation award for purchasing school supplies and making this event a huge success for children in the community.

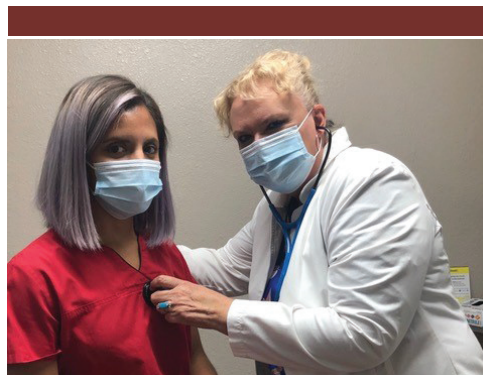
In addition, the funds received from PNM will assist LLPD's "Shop with a Cop" event in December.

## LLPD RECEIVES ACCREDITATION

The Los Lunas Police Department has earned its accreditation for another three years with the New Mexico Law Enforcement Standards Council through the New Mexico Municipal League.

Accreditation is the ongoing process whereby agencies evaluate policy and procedure against established criteria and have compliance with that criteria verified by an independent and authoritative body.

The criteria, or standards, are policy development guidelines that represent a level of quality service delivery. The true indicator of compliance, however, lies with an evaluation by trained, independent professional peers.

The establishment of meaningful and professional standards and an evaluation of compliance with those standards are the two fundamentals of an accreditation program.

The standards are the basis of an accreditation program that affects every component of the agencies involved. Through the dedication to service and professionalism evidenced by the attainment of accredited status, law enforcement agencies can positively affect the communities they serve.

Los Lunas Police Department's Professional Standards Lieutenant Lisa Valenzuela-Medina, worked to ensure LLPD met and, in some cases, exceeded these standards.

As a result of Valenzuela-Medina's work, the Los Lunas Police Department met all the requirements of over 220 professional standards during a rigorous peer review by a team of assessors in June 2021.

The Police Department received a "Certificate of Accreditation" which is proudly displayed at the agency.

The Los Lunas Police Department's Accreditation is for three years.
