Rick Kozak Solo Show: Art of Photojournalism

Rick Kozak was named Best in Show with his piece "Power of the Spirit" for our 12th Annual Art Show in 2024. In recognition of his accomplishment, Mr. Kozak won a solo art show at the Los Lunas Museum to showcase his work. He is a national award-winning photojournalist and has traveled the world documenting news, politics, sports, human behaviors, cultures and the beauty of nature for nearly five decades. Mr. Kozak has had many influences such as photographers Robert Capa, Gordon Parks, Avedon and Ansel Adams. Mr. Kozak wants to inspire others in the use of photography to connect with other people and this amazing world.

Wildlife West Nature Park & Tinkertown Museum Day Trip

Saturday, August 2

Join us for a van trip to the East side of the Sandias - it should be 8-10 degrees cooler there! First we'll go to the Wildlife West Nature Park & Zoo in Edgewood where you'll get to see over 25 certified non-release, friendly animals. Next we'll head to the imaginative Tinkertown Museum in Sandia Park. Call the us at (505) 352-7720 to reserve your spot! Space is limited. Transportation is free; see below for costs of each attraction.



Schedule:

- 9:00 AM - Arrive at Los Lunas Museum and load vans
- 9:15 AM - 10:15 AM - Drive to Wildlife West Nature Park
- 10:15 AM - 12:15 PM - Tour the Nature Park and have lunch
- 12:15 - 12:30 PM - Drive to Tinkertown Museum
- 12:30 - 1:30 PM - Tour Tinkertown
- 1:30 - 2:15 PM - Load vans and drive back to Los Lunas

Wildlife West Admissions: \$12 adult, \$10 senior, \$5 student, Free for veterans and children under 5 years

Tinkertown Admissions: \$6 adult, \$3 children 4-16, Free for children under 4 years and wheelchair users

Bring a sack lunch, sunscreen, hat, and water bottle. The Wildlife West Nature Park & Zoo has a mile long accessible pathway with minimal shade to view the animals. Tinkertown Museum has uneven and narrow walkways that can be a challenge for wheelchairs and walkers. Our van is not accessible, but we can stow some collapsible mobility aid items. Times subject to change, may arrive back at Los Lunas Museum as late as 3:00 PM. We recommend bringing extra quarters along for the Tinkertown Museum.

Historical Highlight



Adelina Isabel Emilia "Nina" Otero - Warren

Nina was the daughter of Manuel B. Otero and Eloisa Luna of Los Lunas. She was a suffragette, educator, politician, homesteader, writer, and business woman. She was a leader in the campaign for women's suffrage both in New Mexico and nationally and she was chair of the women's division of the Republican State Committee for New Mexico. In 1918, she defeated a male opponent in the election for Santa Fe School Superintendent. In 1922, she was the first woman from New Mexico to run for Congress, carrying 80% of the Hispanic districts, although she did lose overall. During the 1930s, Nina served as inspector for the U.S. Indian Service and directed the literacy education program for the Civilian Conservation Corps camps in NM. She published her book, *Old Spain in Our Southwest*, in 1936.
